What the Ground Remembers

There is a particular silence that will settle over our family on the day we stand at his graveside, and I know already it will be nothing like the silence of an empty room. It will be full; full of everything nobody is saying, full of the version of us that existed only weeks ago, before the word "was" replaced the word "is" when we spoke of him. We are counting down to the 8th of August now, the day we lay him in the ground, and the waiting has its own particular ache, grief with a date attached, sorrow you can see coming.

We have brought my father home to Poland, to the resting place of our ancestors, because that is what he would have wanted, and because some part of me believed that returning him to that soil might make the loss make some sense. It hasn't, not yet. Poland is not offering me answers. It is only offering me memory, every street corner, every church bell, every smell of bread from a bakery window, pulling up some earlier version of our family, whole

and unbroken, laughing at a table that suddenly feels impossibly far away.

We used to be a unit. All for one and one for all, that was not just a saying in our house, it was the architecture of how we lived. My father was not the only pillar, but he was the one none of us imagined could fall. And in falling, he seems to have taken something structural with him, because now I watch my mother, the woman who held all of us together through every other storm, disappear into a grief so total it frightens me.

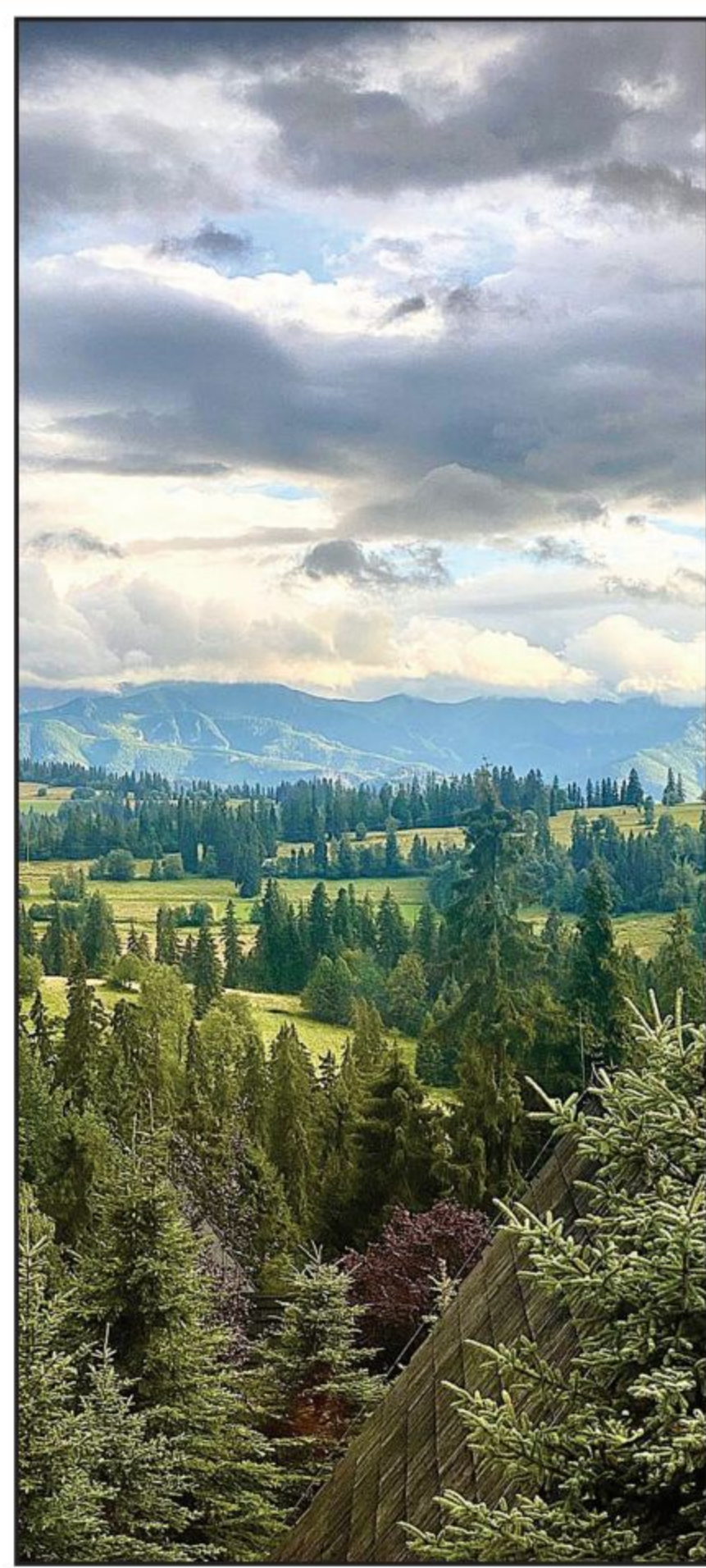
Her heart gave out before her spirit did, and now both are healing at a pace I cannot control and cannot rush. She looks at us, her children standing right beside her, and she does not see reasons to keep going. She sees only the absence of him. I have never felt so useless as I do watching someone I love conclude that love isn't enough of a reason to stay. I don't have a tidy resolution to offer you here, because I don't have one for myself yet either. Some days

the only honest thing I can write is that this is unbearably hard.

But I want to say this, to her and to anyone reading who is standing where we are standing: death is final for the one who has gone. It does not have to be final for the rest of us. The unity we built as a family did not live inside my father alone, it lived in the way he taught us to show up for one another, and that will still be here, on the 8th of August, in whatever hands we are holding on that day. Grief does not erase what a person built in you. If anything, it is the proof of how much they built.

I don't know yet what our family looks like on the other side of this. I only know that we are still, however unsteadily, a "we." My father will soon be in the ground of our ancestors, but the love that made us a unit will not go into the ground with him. It will still be standing, in Poland, in the people who come to bury him and who will, somehow, keep on living.

That is not nothing. Some days, right now, it is everything I have.

I am writing not as a pessimist, but as a concerned resident who still believes in this community and wants to see it protected. Lately, it feels as though the ground beneath us is shifting. Tempers are short, patience is shorter, and too many of us have quietly accepted a new normal: burglar bars on every window, alarm systems we trust more than the response times behind them, and a nagging sense that we are locking ourselves in while those who do us harm move freely.

There is something deeply wrong when law-abiding citizens feel like prisoners in their own homes while offenders seem to move through the system with ease. It chips away at something important, our sense of safety, yes, but

also our faith that doing things the right way still counts for something. When individuals with troubling histories are welcomed rather than questioned, ordinary people are left wondering what standard we are actually holding anyone to.

I don't write this to stir anger for its own sake. I write it because Natal has always been a community that looks out for its own, and that spirit is worth protecting before frustration curdles into something uglier. We need visible policing, accountability that means something, and leadership, local and beyond, willing to say plainly that lawlessness has a cost.

We are better than the picture we're currently living in. Let's not wait for a breaking point to prove it.

A verse has been sitting with me lately, from 2 Timothy 3: a warning about times when people grow proud, self-absorbed, unkind to those closest to them, quick to accuse, slow to forgive, chasing pleasure while quietly losing hold of anything deeper. Reading it, I did not think of some distant, prophesied future. I thought of ordinary days here in Ballito, the hooter that doesn't get a wave back, the elderly neighbour nobody has checked on in weeks, the small unkindnesses we've all started to wave off as "just how things are now."

I don't share this to preach. I share it because I think most of us feel it too, this quiet coarsening, even if we can't always name it. We are busier, more guarded,

Ballito is still full of people capable of that choice. I see it more often than the headlines suggest. Let's keep choosing it, together.

If there was an Olympic event for hypocrisy, I'd struggle to pick a winner. Washington, Brussels, Moscow, Kyiv, Jerusalem and Pretoria would all be standing on the podium demanding a recount.

Let's start with America. This is supposed to be the most powerful nation on Earth. The military giant. The economic powerhouse. The self-appointed guardian of democracy. Now reduced to being Bibi's lackey, sacrificing its people at the altar of Baal. Bibi is back in Washington once again, and to me it looks less like a diplomatic visit and more like the Boss coming to crack the whip. As if that isn't enough, taxpayers are expected to swallow reports of public officials running up eye-watering hotel bills while ordinary South Africans struggle to put fuel in their cars and food on their tables. Corruption investigators resign amid controversy, inquiries disappear into the mist, and accountability remains the rarest commodity in the Republic.

Perhaps that's what disgusts me most is not the wars, not the politics, not even the corruption. It's the astonishing ability of our leaders, everywhere, to look suffering squarely in the face, issue a carefully worded press statement, pose for the cameras and carry on as though civilisation isn't quietly dismantling itself before our eyes.

The emperor has no clothes. The tragedy is that far too many people are still applauding.

On Saturday 18 July 2026, whilst many South Africans were preparing for the South Africa vs Wales rugby match, another cash-in-transit van was blown apart and set alight in Durban, KZN on the N3 near the Pavilion. Thick black smoke climbed into the sky, traffic came to a standstill and before long the photographs were circulating on social media.

Thousands looked at them. Some simply scrolled on. That to me is the real tragedy. Not the cash-in-transit robbery itself. Those crimes have become almost routine in South Africa. It is the fact that we have become so accustomed to them that they barely interrupt our day. We are no longer shocked. We have become desensitised.

Crime is committed by criminals. Every country has them. Some have more than others and South Africa certainly has more than its fair share. We fight crime by arresting criminals, prosecuting

them and locking them away. Lawlessness is something entirely different. Lawlessness begins when ordinary, decent people decide that the rules no longer apply to them.

It starts with ignoring a red traffic light because "everyone else does." Rolling through stop streets. Driving at 160kph because you are in a hurry. Throwing rubbish out of the car window. Bribing an official instead of standing in the queue. Assaulting someone because they insulted you. Refusing to obey lawful instructions because you don't feel like it. Taking the law into your own hands. None of these people think of themselves as criminals. Yet every one of these acts chips away at the foundation of society. The more people see others breaking the rules without consequence, the more

acceptable lawlessness becomes. Eventually, respect for the law disappears altogether. That is when a country finds itself in real trouble.

A criminal has already rejected society's rules. But when ordinary citizens begin rejecting them too, society itself begins to unravel. The greatest danger facing South Africa is not only the number of criminals we have. It is that too many law-abiding citizens are beginning to behave as though the law is optional. Once that mindset takes hold, recovering it is infinitely harder than catching a robber.

Saturday, burning cash-in-transit vehicle is more than another crime scene. It is a reflection. The flames remind us that while criminals continue to challenge the law, the rest of us must never stop respecting it. Because the day ordinary South Africans decide that the law no longer matters, is the day we surrender something far more valuable than money in an armoured vehicle. We surrender the very thing that holds a nation together.

Crime destroys victims. Lawlessness destroys nations. Have a Blessed week and be lawful.

Fort Nottingham Highland Gathering

There will be an agility display by the Knight Security K9 dog unit – in full knight regalia – with their youngest and oldest dog. There will be a display of Medieval Sword fighting, a motor bike drive past, and a Fire Fighters and Fire Truck display from Mooi River.

This year, 2026, is 170 years since the Fort at Fort Nottingham was established. There will be special guests to honour the occasion, and to create a time capsule.

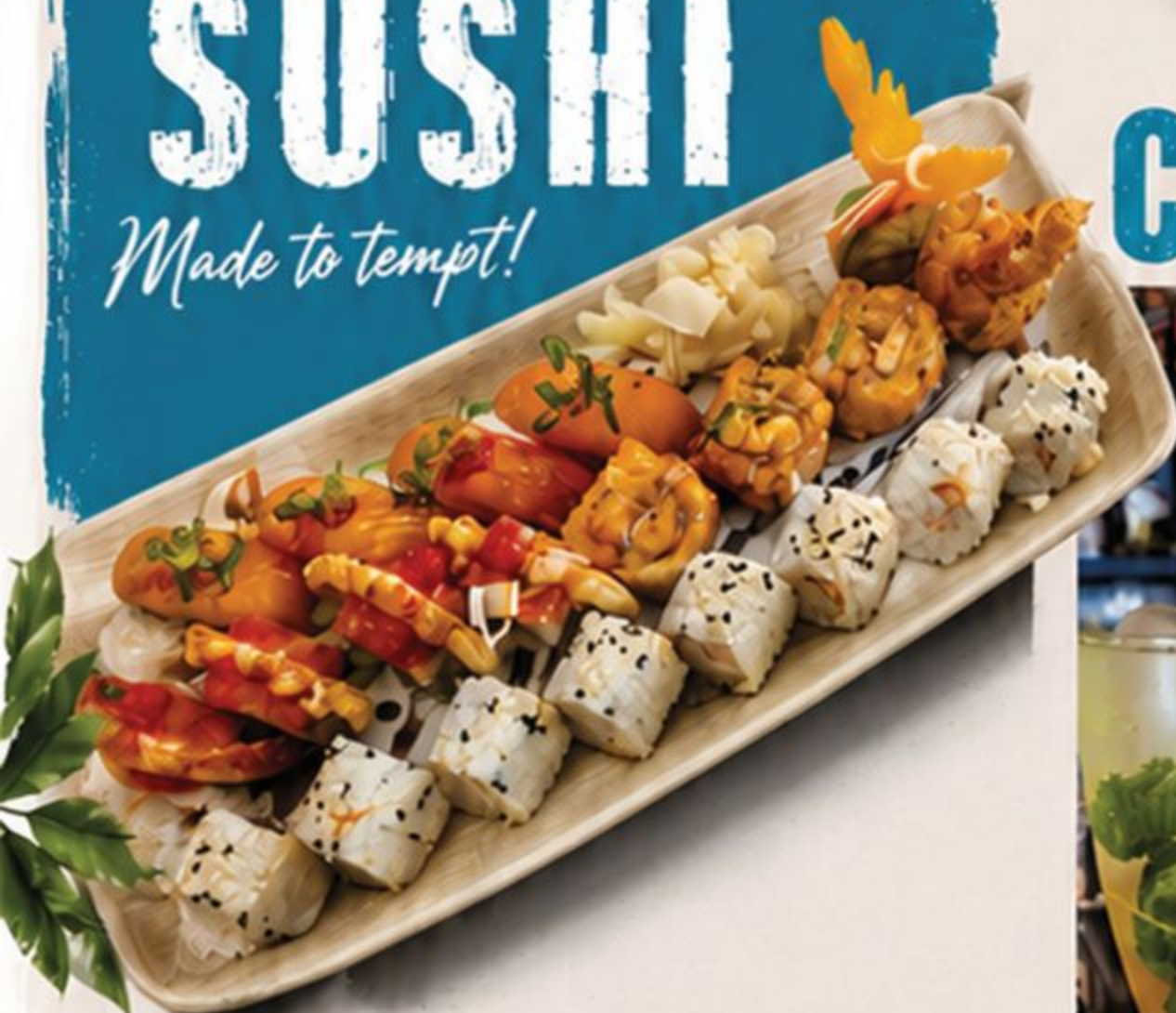

Cooking for Mia and Damian in the Polish Tatra Mountains

Butter Bean & Sweetcorn Patties

Gourmet veggie burger patties built from your pantry; creamy butter beans and potato, sweet bursts of corn, fresh herbs, and toasted nuts and seeds for crunch. Rustic, elegant, and real food.

There's a particular smell that fills a kitchen when onions hit warm olive oil; sweet, a little sharp, unmistakably the start of something. Tonight, that smell is the beginning of dinner for my son and his girlfriend, and as it drifts through the house, I find myself thinking about how far we've drifted, all of us, from this simple ritual.

We live in a world that has made forgetting how to cook feel almost reasonable. Somewhere between the rise of the drive-thru and the glow of the delivery app on our phones, "dinner" quietly became a transaction instead of an act of care. We order in bags of grease-stained cardboard and call it convenience. We hand our kids something wrapped in bright packaging and call it a treat. And slowly, without quite meaning to, we let go of the idea that food made with our own hands, from things that we brought from trusted source, could be just as fast, just as satisfying; maybe more so.

We don't have to choose between what's easy and what's good for us. We don't have to accept that "fast" and "junk" are the same word. Sometimes all it takes is what's already sitting in the fridge, a hot pan, and twenty quiet minutes of chilling in between, time enough to set the table, pour a berry compote, and remember why we cook for the people we love in the first place.

Ingredients

400 grams cooked red butter beans, drained and lightly mashed
300 grams cooked potatoes, mashed
150 grams sweet corn kernels
1 medium onion, finely diced
2 garlic cloves, minced
2 tablespoons fresh dill, finely chopped
2 tablespoons fresh chives, finely chopped
30 grams pine nuts, toasted and roughly chopped
30 grams pumpkin seeds, toasted and roughly chopped
4 tablespoons olive oil, divided (for sautéing and frying)
1 teaspoons salt
0.5 teaspoons black pepper, freshly cracked

Direction:

1. Toast the nuts and seeds: In a dry pan over medium heat, toast 30 grams pine nuts, toasted and roughly chopped and 30 grams pumpkin seeds, toasted and roughly chopped for 3 minutes, tossing often, until golden and fragrant. Tip onto a board, roughly chop, and set aside to cool.
2. Sauté the aromatics: Heat 1 tbsp. of 4 tablespoons olive oil, divided (for sautéing and frying) in the same pan over medium heat. Add 1 medium onion, finely diced and cook for 5 minutes until soft and translucent, then stir in 2 garlic cloves, minced and cook for 1 more minute until fragrant. Remove from heat and let cool slightly.
3. Build the base: In a large bowl, combine 400 grams cooked red

butter beans, drained and lightly mashed and 300 grams cooked potatoes, mashed. Mash together with a fork until mostly smooth but still with a little texture, this is what holds your patties together.

4. Bring it all together: Fold in the sautéed onion and garlic, 150 grams sweet corn kernels, 2 tablespoons fresh dill, finely chopped, 2 tablespoons fresh chives, finely chopped, and the toasted 30 grams pine nuts, toasted and roughly chopped and 30 grams pumpkin seeds, toasted and roughly chopped. Season with 1 teaspoons salt and 0.5 teaspoons black pepper, freshly cracked. Mix well until evenly combined.

5. Shape the patties: Divide the mixture into 6-8 portions and shape into firm patties about 2cm thick. Place on a plate or tray, cover, and chill in the fridge for at least 20 minutes, this firms them up so they hold together beautifully when cooked.

6. Pan-fry until golden: Heat the remaining 4 tablespoons olive oil, divided (for sautéing and frying) in a non-stick or cast iron pan over medium heat. Fry the patties for 9 minutes per side, without moving them too soon, until deeply golden and crisp on the outside and warmed through.

Serve warm in a bun with your favourite trimmings, or on their own with a simple green salad and a dollop of yogurt or a squeeze of lemon.

Notes: If your mixture feels too soft to shape, chill it a little longer rather than adding flour.

Hills, Hybrids, and a Healthy Dose of Sarcasm: Corolla Cross GR-Sport HEV in Zululand

They say you should never let sentimentality get behind the wheel of a Corolla. I disagree, and the hills of Zululand backed me up. I pointed the Corolla Cross GR-Sport HEV North, half expecting the "Gazoo Racing" badge on my Corolla Cross to be nothing more than a marketing wink. It mostly is, if we are being honest, but somewhere between the winding climbs and the long descents, the hybrid system quietly made a fool of my cynicism. The 1.8-litre engine and electric motor combine to

produce 90 kW, hardly a number that inspires bravado, yet the way power arrived, smooth, instant, unbothered by gradient, made every hairpin feel like a small personal victory. Fuel efficiency is where this thing genuinely shows off. Toyota claims 4.3 l/100km, and while I did not manage to be quite that disciplined with my right foot, I comfortably squeezed out well over 700 kilometres before needing fuel again, a figure that made my usual "range anxiety" jokes feel

embarrassingly outdated. Inside, the GR-S touches, red seat belts, sports pedals, a crisp 12.3-inch digital cluster, gave the cabin a sense of occasion that a compact SUV has no real business having. Boot space swallowed luggage, hiking boots, and a slightly excessive amount of snacks without complaint. By the time I rolled back onto tar, I had stopped being sarcastic altogether. The Corolla Cross GR-Sport HEV did not just survive Zululand's hills, it made peace with them, and quietly, so did I.

It is refined, effortless, and genuinely satisfying to drive. If you want to experience it yourself, CMH Volvo Cars Umhlanga is the place to start.

Maintenance during divorce:

The Court Sends a Strong Message on Financial Disclosure

If you're asking the court for maintenance during a divorce, honesty isn't optional—it's essential.

On 13 July 2026 a High Court judgment sent a powerful message to divorcing spouses: inflate your expenses, hide your income, or fail to disclose your finances, and you risk losing your claim altogether.

The case concerned a Rule 43 application, which allows a spouse to seek temporary maintenance and financial assistance while divorce proceedings are still pending. These applications are designed to be quick, giving families financial stability until the divorce is finalised.

In this matter, the wife initially claimed over R59,000 per month, together with payment of the household expenses and R300,000 towards her legal costs. The husband argued that many of the expenses were exaggerated, duplicated or

unsupported and that the wife had failed to fully disclose her financial position.

Things unravelled when the wife later admitted that several expenses had been double-counted, reducing her claim by more than a third. The court found that she had still not made a full and frank disclosure of her income, business interests and liabilities. That omission proved costly.

The judge stressed that Rule 43 applications depend on complete honesty. Because these applications are decided quickly, courts simply do not have the time to investigate every bank account, business or investment. The duty rests squarely on the applicant to disclose everything that is relevant.

One of the judgment's strongest messages was that Rule 43 is not a "meal ticket." It exists to provide fair, temporary financial support—not to reward inflated claims or create a long-

term source of income.

Although the court was highly critical of the applicant's conduct, it also recognised that two minor children were involved. Instead of dismissing the application outright, the court ordered the husband to pay R25,000 per month, continue paying the bond, household expenses, medical costs and school fees, and contribute R40,000 towards the wife's legal costs.

If you approach the court for maintenance, remember that credibility is one of your greatest assets. Full financial disclosure isn't just good practice—it's the foundation upon which your case stands. Lose your credibility, and you may lose far more than you expected.
